

AT HOME PICK-UP RECYCLING

1. DO **NOT** BAG YOUR RECYCLING.

PLACE RECYCLABLES LOOSE IN YOUR RECYCLING CART.

Plastic bags can be dropped off at grocery stores and retail locations with a special collection bin.

2. ITEMS SHOULD BE EMPTY, CLEAN, AND DRY.

3. DON'T WISHCYCLE.

Include only the items listed below in your recycling cart.

WM provides rear-yard recycling every other week for village residents. Combine cans; cardboard; cups (aluminum, paper, and some plastic); glass bottles and jars; paper and boxes; as well as plastic bottles, jugs, and tubs loose (unbagged) in the provided wheeled cart.

Important Tips for Recycling Right!



METAL CANS & CUPS

CUPS (PAPER & PLASTIC)



PLASTIC BOTTLES, JUGS, AND TUBS

Empty and rinse.

Place lids inside cans or leave slightly attached.

Labels do not need to be removed.

YES - aluminum cups, soda + beer cans, soup, tuna, vegetable, cat + dog food cans, cookie/tea tins

NO - scrap metal or hardware, propane tanks, aluminum foil, aerosol cans, batteries, electronics

Remove and discard inside packaging (i.e. plastic bags, strapping, Styrofoam).

Flatten all boxes.

Keep cardboard dry.

YES - corrugated cardboard, paper boxes, shipping boxes, boxboard, paperboard, and pizza boxes (no food, no excess cheese or grease)

NO - soiled or wet boxes, milk/juice/wine cartons, juice boxes, ice cream cartons

Empty and rinse.

Place lids loose in recycling cart.

Labels do not need to be removed.

YES - wine, beer, vinegar, oil + drink bottles, glass jars

NO - ovenware (Pyrex), candle jars, decorative items, drinking glasses, ceramic cups/mugs, mirrors, window glass, crystal, light bulbs, broken glass

Empty and flatten boxes.

Keep paper dry.

YES - magazines, newspaper, junk mail, envelopes, postcards, plain greeting cards, phone books, paper bags, cereal/food/shoe boxes, medicine boxes, paper egg cartons, paperboard, frozen food boxes, office paper, wrapping paper, paperback books, hardcover books (remove cover and binding)

NO - soiled or wet papers, milk/juice/wine cartons, juice boxes, ice cream cartons, paper plates, napkins, towels, shredded paper, photographs, tissue paper, receipts

Empty and rinse.

Discard lids and straws.

Do not nest or stack cups

YES - plastic to-go cups, takeout, or fast-food cups. Paper cups for hot and cold beverages

NO - Plastic party cups (i.e., Solo, Dixie, or Hefty cups), Styrofoam cups, K-cups, coffee pods, ceramic cups/mugs

Empty and rinse. Attach the cap or lid.

Recycle by shape: Include bottles and jars with a neck/opening narrower than body.

Include yogurt cups and plastic tubs.

A recycling mobius (symbol) doesn't mean it's recyclable!

YES - water, soda, milk, juice, shampoo, bleach, laundry detergent jugs + bottles, peanut butter or mayo jars, yogurt cups, plastic dairy tubs (butter, sour cream, yogurt, etc.)

NO - plastic clamshells, takeout/to-go containers, plastic egg cartons, cat litter pails, plastic bags/film, Styrofoam, utensils, straws, flower pots/flats, buckets

Hunting Valley's recycling is processed by WM in Oakwood Village. List of acceptable items as of 7/2026.

NOT RECYCLABLE

Miscellaneous Items for TRASH: Foam peanuts and packing materials, toys, pots and pans, ceramics, hoses, ropes, plastic hangers.

Latex Paint: Dry paint using cat litter, Oil-Dri, or other absorbent products. Once hard, replace lid, and place in the trash.

Needles/Sharps: Best to use WM Medwaste solution. See CuyahogaRecycles.org. Otherwise, needles and sharps can be placed in a rigid container, sealed securely, and placed in the trash.

DONATE Clothing/Household Goods: Pass It On-A Resource-Full Guide via website under programs/publications for donating usable items or use the "What Do I Do With" search engine on CuyahogaRecycles.org.

COMPOST Food Waste: Either at home or use local company *Rust Belt Riders* to dispose of food waste

Batteries: Single-use (AA, etc.), non-rechargeable; alkaline batteries go in the trash. Drop off rechargeable batteries at Home Depot, Lowe's, Staples. Lead acid (vehicle) batteries to a scrap metal yard for \$. See The Battery Network for more details.

Fluorescent Bulbs: Home Depot, Lowe's, and BatteriesPlus may accept. Do not place in trash. See CuyahogaRecycles.org for details

Propane and Other Tanks/Cylinders: 20# grill tanks to Blue Rhino or AirGas. See CuyahogaRecycles.org for details.

Village Hall Recycling DROP-OFF at the Hunting Valley Service Department: Monday-Friday 9 a.m.-2 p.m.

Household Hazardous Waste: Oil-based + acrylic paints, paint thinners, lawn/garden chemicals, automotive fluids, aerosol cans with flammable warnings, varnishes, polyurethanes, items with mercury (thermometers), chemicals marked poisonous, adhesives, driveway sealer, pool chemicals, cooking oil, grease, roof tar, pesticides, household cleaners (**All containers MUST HAVE original labeling and not leak**)

Scrap Metal: Includes appliances, clean aluminum foil and trays

Fire Extinguishers

Tires* Automotive only without rims and 20" or less

Computers/Electronics: Computers, laptops, monitors, keyboards, printers, terminals, modems, cables, software, cell phones and their accessories. NO TVs.

Medications: Please bring all prescription medications to the Hunting Valley Police Department.

Other items: Holiday lights, campaign signs, distressed American flags

PRACTICE BETTER RECYCLING AT HOME TODAY

- 1. No plastic bags, plastic film, or tin foil.*
- 2. No hoses, Christmas lights, wire, ropes, etc. that tangle in equipment.*
- 3. Keep recycling clean and dry.*
- 4. No broken glass.*
- 5. Keep items smaller than a credit card out of the recycling cart.*
- 6. Take all scrap metal to the HV service center.*
- 7. No mixed materials (potato chip cans) or plastic pouches.*
- 8. It's OK to throw it away. Some items have reached the end of their useful life.*
- 9. Focus on items out of the kitchen and bathroom, not the garage or garden.*
- 10. Continue to educate yourself and family*
