3. REPLACE ALL CAPS + FLATTEN BOXES

Important highlights noted

Plastic Bags: Recycle at grocery stores, Kohls Target, etc. that offer plastic bag collection



PLASTIC BOTTLES, JUGS + TUBS

Empty and rinse. Attach lid.



CANS

Empty and rinse.



GLASS BOTTLES & JARS

Empty and rinse.



Paper



CUPS (PLASTIC)

Empty and rinse. Discard straws. Attach lid.



Frozen food carton



CARDBOARD

Empty and flatten.

Recycle plastic based on shape! Only items with a neck/opening narrower than body and soft plastic tubs



Symbol doesn't necessarily mean it's recyclable!

YES - water, soda, milk, juice, shampoo, bleach, laundry detergent jugs + bottles, jars with opening narrower than body (ie. peanut butter) + soft tubs that come with lids (butter, sour cream, yogurt, etc.)

NO - other plastic containers / tubs (ie. takeout, berry/produce, egg, cat litter, empty motor oil), plastic bags, film, Styrofoam™, utensils, straws, flower pots, buckets

Place lids inside cans only if attached

Removing labels is helpful but not necessary

YES - soda + beer cans, soup, tuna, vegetable, cat + dog food cans, and small metal boxes with tops (e.g., tea)

NO - other miscellaneous scrap metal, propane tanks, aluminum foil, aerosol cans

Removing labels is helpful but not necessary. Replace caps

YES - wine, beer, vinegar, oil + drink bottles, glass jars

NO - ovenware (Pyrex), candle jars, decorative items, thin-walled drinking glasses, mirror, window glass, crystal, light bulbs, broken glass, mason jars

YES - magazines, newspaper, junk mail, envelopes, postcards, greeting cards, phone books, paper bags, food + medicine boxes, office paper, wrapping paper, paperback books, hardcover books without cover and binding. Paper egg cartons

NO - paper plates, napkins, towels, shredded paper, photographs, tissue paper, receipts

YES - Aluminum cups and acceptable plastic cups that include to-go, takeout, or fast-food cups.

NO - Plastic solo and party cups and paper cups. Discard lids and straws, K-cups, coffee pods

Note do not nest or stack cups

Flatten when possible

YES - Frozen food containers (not ice cream)

NO - Milk, juice, soap, wine cartons, juice boxes, etc. and takeout meal and ice cream containers

Flatten all boxes

Remove any packaging inside (ie. plastic bags or styrofoam)

YES - dry food, cardboard, paperboard, cereal boxes, frozen food boxes (not ice cream)

NO - soiled or wet papers, ice cream containers, greasy pizza boxes

Miscellaneous Items for TRASH:

Foam peanut + packing materials, toys, pans + ceramics, hoses, ropes, and plastic hangers

Latex Paint: Dry paint using cat litter, Oil-Dri or other absorbent products. Once hard, replace lid + place in trash bag

Needles/Sharps: Best to use Waste Management Medwaste solution via CCSWD website. Otherwise, Needles + Sharps can be placed in a rigid container, sealed securely + disposed in trash

DONATE Clothing/Household

Goods: Pass It On-A Resource-Full Guide via website under programs / publications for donating usable items or use the "What Do I Do With" search engine on CuyahogaRecycles.org

COMPOST Food Waste: Either at home or use local company *Rust Belt Riders* to dispose of food waste

Batteries: Single use (AA, etc) non rechargeable, alkaline into trash or home depot, Lowe's or staples Rechargeable to hardware or home improvement store. Lead (vehicle) to scrap metal yard for \$. Call2Recycle.org for more details

Fluorescent: Home depot, Lowe's or bulb stores may accept. Not into garbage. See CCSWD for details

Propane and other tanks/cylinders: 20# to Blue Rhino, otherwise see CCSWD site for details

Village Hall Recycling DROP OFF at the Hunting Valley Service Department: Monday - Friday 9am - 2pm

Household Hazardous Waste such as: Oil-based + acrylic paints, paint thinners, lawn/garden chemicals, automotive fluids, aerosol cans with flammable warnings, varnishes, polyurethanes, items with mercury (thermometers), chemicals marked poisonous, adhesives, driveway sealer, pool chemicals, cooking oil, grease, roof tar, pesticides, household cleaners (**All containers MUST HAVE original labeling and not leak**). **No gasoline or Kerosene please**

Scrap Metal: Includes appliances, clean aluminum foil and trays

Fire Extinguishers

Tires* Automotive only without rims and 20" or less

Computers/Electronics: Computers, laptops, monitors, keyboards, printers, terminals, modems, cables, software, cell phones and their accessories. NO TVs

Medications: Please bring all prescription medications to the **Hunting Valley Police Department** for proper disposal

Other items: Holiday lights, distressed American flags

PRACTICE BETTER RECYCLING TODAY

- 1. No plastic bags, flimsy plastic and tin foil***
- 2. No hoses, Xmas lights, ropes etc. that tangle equipment***
- 3. Keep recycling clean and dry***
- 4. Eliminate broken glass***
- 5. Keep small items out***
- 6. Scrap metal goes to HV service center***
- 7. Best to not recycle items with multiple types of materials***
- 8. Some items have reached the end of their useful life***
- 9. Focus on items out of the kitchen, not garage or garden***
- 10. Continue to educate yourself and family***
